We appreciate your interest and welcome both individual and group applications.

Requirements for acceptance

- Elders must be at least 55 years old, including each member of an Elder Group. (Facilitators may be of any age.)
- Elder Groups must have an established meeting place and a facilitator.
- Elders agree to log into the EWC platform regularly (two or more times per week), respond to a minimum of ten letters within the 45 days immediately following acceptance, and average at least six letters a month thereafter. While each individual and group is different, generally this translates into a commitment of approximately 1–2 hours per week.
- Elders agree to respect diversity, treat advice seekers and other EWC members with respect, be receptive to input from EWC Administration and adhere to all EWC policies.
- We ask each Elder to donate or raise at least \$20/month for the EWC community to sustain our services. Elders can pay that annually, quarterly, monthly, etc. The payment can also come from family or friends, Readathons, Facebook posts, or other efforts. This helps underwrite the costs of your six letters monthly (\$3.25/letter). Do you agree?

- Visit our [Read Advice] page and browse through recent letters and Elder responses to get a sense of who we are, as well as the tone and style of the letters that we typically send to our advice seekers.

If you are sending an application for a group, include your name as well as the first names and ages of each member.

- 15. Do you possess the minimum required computer skills as outlined in the [FAQs]?

NOTE: We work on a cooperative basis in which Elders are encouraged to lend their talents to the administrative operation of the organization. After you have completed a probationary period, you will be asked to become a member of a committee. We will contact you to let you know where we have a need and to learn where you have skills and interest in participating.

PART II

In this phase of the application, you will respond to two (2) real letters we have received and answered at the EWC. You will choose these letters from a queue on our website, much the same way our working Elders do.

There are no limitations or restrictions on the length of an Elder's response to any advice request. However, it is important that you carefully review your response. The response should be empathetic, non-judgmental, thoughtful, thorough, and practical.

We will evaluate your responses to the two sample questions based on these criteria, as well as on your writing competency, including accurate spelling, punctuation, grammar, sentence structure, composition, and formatting.

As a reminder, due to our non-profit charter, we offer NO specific medical, veterinary, legal, tax, or financial advice. Further, Elders are not permitted to reveal professional backgrounds to validate their opinions, to avoid them being interpreted as professional advice.
